# From the Manse.....

Back in my Infant School days when Halloween was something that was done 'over there' in America, I can still recall singing along with my friends: *"Remember, remember, the fifth of November"* as we looked forward to the excitement of bonfire night.

At that young age I didn't know how the rest of the rhyme went "*Remember, remember, the fifth of November, Gunpowder, treason and plot! If you can't give us one, we'll take two; the better for us and the worse for you!*" nor of course appreciate that it commemorated religious intolerance and sectarian violence in the early 17<sup>th</sup> century.

As we move through the tail end of October into the month of November, we find ourselves in a period when we do indeed reflect, recall and remember.

On Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday, we will, at 11:00 am, in silence and respect, remember and respond to the words of Laurence Binyon:

"They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them."

All Saints and All Hallows also give us the opportunity to remember and in more 'normal years and circumstances' we would have been holding our own services of remembrance at this time, gathering to remember and give thanks to God for those whom we still love but see no longer.

As the days grow shorter and the nights longer and darker, our thoughts naturally turn to the months that have passed and what has been as we head towards the end of the year. This year, 2020, a year that we couldn't imagine turning out as it has when it first started.

As we continue to be battered and shaken by politics and pandemic alike and we wonder when all this will end, may we find hope, help and comfort in some words of God as found in the book of Isaiah, who reminds us that God has not forgotten us and that he continually remembers us, for he has written our names on the palm of his hand. (Isaiah 49:16)

May we remember that God is always with us and in that eternal truth, find strength not only for this day but for all days.

# Sunday Worship

- Please book ahead each week to attend worship by telephoning or emailing Clive & Alison Phillips on 01235 760335 or by email to <u>candaphillips@gmail.com</u> by Friday lunch time before the Sunday. Clive and Alison will reply to answer machine messages or emails to confirm that the place has been reserved
- Please observe social distancing.
- Please sanitise your hands on entry.
- Please scan the Wantage Methodist Church QR code for the NHS-Covid19 app displayed at the entrances if you have the app.
- If you wish to use a Bible and hymn book, we encourage you to bring your own wherever possible.
- Please bring your own cushion and bottled water with you if you need them.
- You will need to keep your coats etc. with you.
- You should wear a face covering whilst in church. Some people are exempt from wearing a face covering for various reasons and will not be required to do so while attending worship.
- Sadly we may not sing.
- There will be no creche, Junior Church or Kids@Church for the time being.
- Should you require to use the toilet at any time, please speak to the "Link" door steward.
- You should sanitise your hands as you leave.
- There will be a basket for any offering you wish to be make either on your way in or way out.
- When the service has ended, please leave promptly in an orderly fashion so as to maintain social distancing.

Coming to a service will always involve an element of risk, although we are committed to making sure that the risk is as small as we can make it. You must decide for yourself whether this is a risk you wish to take and the decision will be different for different people. If you don't want to physically come to a church service that is fine, we are all still one Church. We are committed to ensure that there will be a Zoom service each week either from the service held in church or alongside the service held in church.

Initially there will not be break out groups after Zoom service when it comes live from the Chapel but we will develop things so that this is possible.

Also other material for worship at home that has been available since lockdown will continue to be supplied.
