From the Manse.....

It was Queen Elizabeth (the Queen Mother) who brought to her husband's attention a little know poem by Minnie Louise Haskins, entitled "God knows". Written in 1908 and privately published in 1912, it was part of a collection entitled "*The Desert*".

As a result, <u>King George VI</u> quoted it in his <u>1939 Christmas broadcast</u> that first December of the Second World war.

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied: "Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way." So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night. And He led me towards the hills and the breaking of day in the lone East.

These words have understandably been used many times these past weeks as we looked to the dawning of 2021, wondering what the future might hold and surrounded with all the uncertainty, anxiety and worry of these days.

That though, is not the end of the poem - for it continues.....

So heart be still: What need our little life Our human life to know, If God hath comprehension? In all the dizzy strife Of things both high and low, God hideth His intention.

God knows. His will Is best. The stretch of years Which wind ahead, so dim To our imperfect vision, Are clear to God. Our fears Are premature; In Him, All time hath full provision.

Then rest: until God moves to lift the veil From our impatient eyes, When, as the sweeter features Of Life's stern face we hail, Fair beyond all surmise God's thought around His creatures Our mind shall fill.

Here, we find resonances to passages and sentiments of scripture, St. Paul and Isaiah being but two who immediately come to mind.

Echoes also of the words we have so recently shared in our Covenant service where we have handed over everything to God and placed our hope and trust in him, culminating in the acknowledgement and affirmation that "we are no longer our own but yours".

Whatever this year may bring we are not alone and we do not face it by ourselves. We are in this together; together as a community of faith and together as daughters and sons of God, (acknowledged or not).

We find comfort in the words of the hymn writer:

"*But lo! there breaks a yet more glorious day*" and acknowledge as we do, that this too shall pass.

Until then, we commit ourselves to holding the Christ light for others even as they hold it for us.

Welcome to 2021 and a happy new year

Of course we are not starting the year as we would have liked to. We are closed again for the foreseeable future but give thanks that despite all the times we have had to close over the last few months our finances have held up due to donations, the furlough scheme, and a period of rent holiday for which we are most grateful.

Orders

I will be in the shop occasionally to monitor post and emails. If you wish to order a book then please email your request and I will arrange for collection or delivery once it arrives.

If anyone has not collected their bible notes for January we may be able to arrange delivery and would ask for payment online.

Christmas

We provided a much reduced number of Christmas lunches this year over three days rather than the four or five as in previous years. We served 47 people in house and provided 12 takeaway meals – of the 47 eaten in, nine were people invited by us who would normally have been invited to our special 'family' Christmas meal.

We did also donate a large amount of Traidcraft biscuits and chocolate to the gifts organized by Beverley who runs the Launderette. More than half of those gifts went to people we know who would be alone or isolating at Christmas.

Brexit

Although we won't be directly affected Traidcraft and other wholesalers could be and we may indirectly struggle to get some items. Please pray for Traidcraft that they will still be able to obtain their stock.

Prayer breakfasts

As we are unable to meet in person, details of items to pray for as well as a thought for the month is sent round for the second Saturday in each month. I have sent out this month's today, so do let me know if you didn't receive it and would like to.

We very much look forward to re-opening when we can, but in the meantime we will keep you updated.

We continue to remember all of our church family who are in poor health or have other difficulties and problems compounded by the coronavirus situation. We remember especially Jim and Cathy Voller separated by ill health after their long life together, and all who are missing close contact with their family and special friends.

What is happening?

Worship

During the lockdown periods we have been meeting with others in the Circuit for worship each Sunday at 10:30 am on the Zoom platform. About 100-110 connections are made to each service with about 150 people involved each week. Whilst this has been good for many with internet access, we have been aware that this does not work for everyone. We know that some have been sharing virtual services from other places, YouTube on the internet or on the radio. For those who preferred reflective worship Keith and the circuit staff have been creating worship materials which have been distributed by email or in print form through pastoral visitors or friends. The Methodist Church nationally have also been publishing services for worship at home, online and through the Methodist Recorder.

If you have not been getting access to any of these resources and would wish to in the future, please contact Rev Keith Underhill, Ann Barber or one of the stewards and they will try to ensure you get access to what you need.

In the short periods between lockdown, we have held services in the chapel and broadcast that on Zoom for those not physically present. As you are aware those present are not permitted to sing or mix socially. It is our intention even when restrictions are lifted to continue to make Wantage morning worship available on Zoom each week for those unable to attend in person and we are working hard to make this as good an experience as we can. Proper internet access is now installed in the church buildings which allows transmission and reception of resources and services throughout the buildings.

Worship in the Chapel will only resume when the area is in the equivalent of Tier 2 or below. We are not expecting this to be before Easter at the earliest.

June Grunwald has led an initiative to have a "Worship on Wednesday" monthly afternoon event when it first seemed that there was a possibility of restarting some activities. However the almost immediate restoration of restrictions has made this impractical.

Notices & Newsletter

We have continued to publish Notices every week to the Wantage Methodist Church website. These can be downloaded, printed and distributed by anyone.

The monthly newsletter has also been published each month and we will continue to do so in 2021 at a slightly higher frequency (see page 5) to share news from the local churches, Circuit and wider church. This is posted on both the Wantage Methodist Church website and the Wantage and Abingdon Circuit website. Paper copies are distributed to all who request them and we are grateful to Ann and Andrew Barber as well as the Pastoral Visitors for making this happen.

Church Life

One of the real challenges of the pandemic has been how to keep social contact with everyone. Our pastoral visitors have worked hard to do this.

Knit & Chat meet on Zoom at 2:30 pm on the first and third Monday each month and have succeeded in the creation and distribution of about 1800 angels this year. If you wish to be part of this please contact Helen Carter.

Tea @Three meets weekly at 3 pm on Tuesdays on Zoom just to chat. If you wish to be part of this please contact Keith.

Thanks to Eileen for continuing to email the **Tuesday House Group** each Monday with details for our prayer time that week, when each Tuesday, although apart. we have united in prayer at 3:00 pm.

It was an absolute joy to meet with **YMOSES** in December (despite the fact that we were sitting 2 metres apart with masks on!). We looked at the Christmas story from a different angle reflecting on the diverse group of people who were brought together in the stable around Jesus. We thought and talked about how we could share that love and good news Jesus brought to earth in our daily lives.

In January Kylah Rowlands, who has come to the group for years, offered to prepare something for all the young people and made a wonderful, thought-provoking video and shared a favourite song.

We have tried to keep in touch with all the families who are part of **kids@church** as we have been unable to meet since February. We delivered an advent calendar and Christmas greetings to each home at the end of November and really look forward to welcoming the families back when it is safe to do so.

Please continue to hold all our young people in your thoughts and prayers as they navigate their way through this uncertain time.

Wednesday Fellowship and **Drop in Café** are both sadly suspended for the time being. June and Eileen have been able to keep some contact going with some regulars to the Community Cafe who don't attend our chapel.

We all deal with the various lockdowns differently. If you know of any church folk who are feeling isolated or unwell, please let Ann Barber or Keith Underhill know. And also let Eileen Rennie know of any prayer requests.

Property & Finance

While our church buildings are closed for worship, we are very grateful to the Property team for calling in on a regular basis to make sure that all is well and that any necessary maintenance work is carried out.

The Church treasurer is glad to report that many have continued their regular giving since the beginning of the Pandemic, mainly by cheque or standing order, and he is very grateful to all those who contribute to our church life in this way. A summary report of church financial situation will be available for the Annual Church Meeting in April.

Service in the Community

Members continue to contribute to the wider community.

A number of people have been involved with Ray Collins' coordination issues doing phone minding duties and driving.

We have had teams involved in the Food Bank work particularly over the Christmas period when we also had our building used for storage and packing. Street Pastors have had a limited activity over the past months.

On top of this voluntary effort there are also our people professionally involved in retail, transport, medical support, social care and teaching and child care.

As we reflect on the year which has passed with a mixture of thoughts, and in wondering about the unexpected and unfamiliar experiences through which we have emerged into the new year, the words on the front of our current membership tickets, linking 2020 and 2021, seem to be so aptly chosen: *"The best of all is God is with us"*. What greater reassurance for everything which lies ahead can there be? I am writing this shortly after our annual Covenant Service. Of all our services of collective worship throughout the year, this is the one which bears the deepest significance for us. As we respond to the usual, the unexpected and even the seemingly almost impossible challenges which we may face, the words of our covenant re commitment can be spoken assuredly, because we can trust God to be beside us as we step into every new situation.

In his address, Keith spoke of the importance of words - those which we sing and those which we speak. For our team of Pastoral Visitors during the last ten months, words have been, almost exclusively, the means by which we have sought to fulfil the role which we are privileged to hold. We all regret that the restrictions of the Coronavirus deny us permission to add a comforting hug, a warm handshake, an encouraging smile or even shared tears when we want to convey the warmth of our care and love for each other. Similarly, we cannot meet physically, offer help in as many practical ways, or share celebrations as we could until essential lockdown rules came into force nearly a year ago. However, the absence of home visits or social meetings has not suspended our contact, or withdrawn our support for each other. Thankfully we've used other means by which carefully chosen words have communicated to those on our pastoral lists our continuing prayers and concern. Phone calls, emails, cards and notelets are some of the ways in which words have expressed our thoughts, and hopefully offered some comfort, encouragement and reassurance of God's unending love.

As Pastoral Visitors recommissioned to God's service through this responsibility, we will try to sustain this practice, and with God's help, to offer care and support in every way we can during the coming year.

HMP Bullingdon news

The chaplains at HMP Bullingdon have asked me to say a huge 'THANK YOU' for the 400 cards we sent for them to distribute to the men to send to their families. Those were distributed to all the wings at the prison, with many men being able to send cards to their family. The prison also has youth offenders held there and they were enabled to send cards out too.

The pandemic has hit the prisoners hard as they spend more time locked in their cells and social activities have been curtailed. Church services cannot be held as before with the chaplaincy team being restricted to holding a service for just one wing at a time. Hence the men do not get the weekly support they were used to through going to those services. No chapel volunteers have been allowed into the prison since March and there have been no Alpha or Sycamore Tree (victim awareness) courses and no counselling or bereavement counselling. It has been extremely difficult for visitors to book as slot as so few people have been allowed at any one time in the visitors' hall.

As you can gather, life it not easy in Bullingdon for anyone. All at the prison are on our weekly prayer list and those prayers are much needed and also much appreciated.
