

### Advent Letter 2021 from\_Helen Cameron - Chair, Northampton District

My dear sisters and brothers,

I write to you at the beginning of Advent 2021 and towards the end of a year when we continue to know disruption, continued anxiety and though many are now vaccinated against Covid, and those vaccinations boosted, continued pressure this winter on our NHS and emergency services. We do trust that this year families will be able to visit and support one another at Christmas although I note that those in care homes are still experiencing considerable limitations. It is my custom to share a poem with you and my choice this year is written by Steve Turner, who writes for children,

Christmas is really for the children. Especially for children who like animals, stables, stars and babies wrapped in swaddling clothes. Then there are wise men, kings in fine robes, humble shepherds and a hint of rich perfume.

Easter is not really for the children unless accompanied by a cream filled egg. It has whips, blood, nails, a spear and allegations of body snatching. It involves politics, God and the sins of the world. It is not good for people of a nervous disposition. They would do better to think on rabbits, chickens and the first snowdrop of spring.

Or they'd do better to wait for a re-run of Christmas without asking too many questions about what Jesus did when he grew up or whether there's any connection.

The darker side of the birth narrative in Matthew's Gospel includes the slaughter of all the male children under two years around Bethlehem at the orders of a tyrant King. Even if legend, other innocents continue to be slaughtered, even drowning in the English Channel under our gaze. There is nothing cosy about the promised presence of God with us, but there is the challenge of what God's radical and inclusive love means, and calls us to become. May we not just worship the Christ child but follow him.
