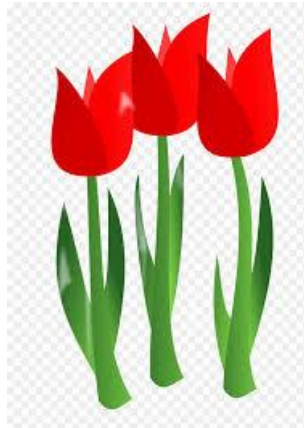

From the Manse.....

The liturgical year that marks the times and season of the church's calendar is marked by colour as well as words.

This is demonstrated by the fact that we change the colour of the pulpit fall in accordance with the church seasons.

White is always used for both Christmas and Easter, whilst the fire of Pentecost is suitably marked by the colour red.

Advent and Lent, the two great seasons of preparation, of self examination, of prayer and sacrifice, of getting ready to enter the mysteries of Christmas and Easter respectively are always purple.

The other weeks of the church year are referred to as Ordinary Time and are green in colour. All four Sundays in February are in Ordinary Time and are therefore marked green.

In the Godly Play telling of the importance of the liturgical year, there are 52 coloured bricks to be found around the clock face - one for each Sunday of the year. Of course, the number of green Sundays between Christmas and Lent vary depending where Easter falls. If Easter is early, there are fewer and more green bricks are to be found between Pentecost and Advent, and vice versa if Easter is later.

It is a pictorial reminder of how beginnings and endings are but part and parcel of the same thing as we watch the hands on the liturgical clock continue their cyclical journey around the colours of the church year. For every goodbye there is a hello and for every hello a goodbye.

Godly Play also gives us a much more interesting title for these green Sundays rather than the unfortunate and unimaginative title of Ordinary Sundays that seem to suggest that they are nothing special, or of lesser worth.

Godly Play calls them growing Sundays - times when we learn and discover, when we grow and deepen our understanding of our faith. Times that are shot through with the truths of Christmas, Easter and Pentecost as together we work out how they bring the extraordinary into the every day.

Green of course, is the colour of growth and we can already see signs of green shoots all around us, from the catkins that are now hanging on bare trees to the stalks and stems of snowdrops. The evenings are beginning to shorten and the days to lengthen and there is a sense of anticipation in the air.

As we leave the stable and Bethlehem behind us, say our farewells to Magi and shepherds, may we seek to grow like the Christ child in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God.

Reflecting on the life of Archbishop Desmond Tutu

Church leaders have reacted to the news of the death of Archbishop Desmond Tutu:



The Revd Sonia Hicks, President of the Methodist Conference, said:

"As a Black Christian, I grew up aware that the late Archbishop Desmond Tutu did not allow the presuppositions of other people to define his own self-identity and self-worth, even under apartheid. That awareness fuelled my desire for a more just and inclusive world for all. I pray for those mourning his loss today and hope that his work for justice in South Africa and the world over continues to burn bright.

"As the late Archbishop said:

'There comes a point where we need to stop just pulling people out of the river. We need to go upstream and find out why they're falling in.'"

Barbara Easton, Vice-President of the Methodist Conference, said:

"It is with huge sadness that we learn of the death of Archbishop Desmond Tutu. Tutu was a man whose deep Christian devotion enabled him to see each and every human being as the expression of the image of God in all its beloved and beautiful diversity. This fired a passion for justice, truth and healing which brought him to the forefront of the leadership of national life in South Africa and on the world stage. His faith gave him the strength to do, to dare and to defy.

"Those of us who only knew him through his writings take heart from his wisdom and insight, which was both accessible and deeply challenging; people who had the good fortune of knowing him speak also of his joyful exuberance, pastoral grace and irrepressible, infectious laugh!

"My thoughts are particularly with his family at this time. He will be much missed."

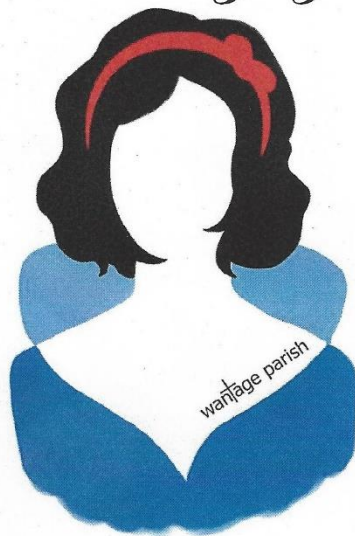
The Revd Michaela Youngson, Assistant Secretary of the Methodist Conference, said:

From what we've learned so far, it was a successful experience which they both enjoyed. No doubt we'll hear more in future sermons, as we enjoy having them back with us.

Prue Cathcart: A sad event for us to record at the beginning of this year is the passing of one of our dearly loved, elderly members. Prue died on Thursday 6th January at the age of 95. Having been very unwell, and spent a short time in St Katharine's over Christmas, she was very pleased to return home to her apartment in Betjeman Court, but died peacefully that evening. 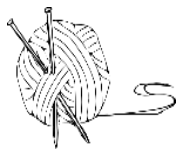
Prayer is an important part of our meeting and we spend time each week praying for people and situations near and far. If you have someone or a situation you would like us to pray for please let me know.
