#### From the Manse.....

Many a parent, grandparent, family friend and neighbour will have, I am sure, with a teary eye watched their little ones perform in the Primary School nativity.

Shyly standing there trying to remember their lines whilst simultaneously sneaking a look to see if they can catch your attention, they offer you a wave or smile.

Along come Mary and Joseph desperately looking for somewhere to stay as they keep on knocking on inn keepers' doors only to be told that there is no room. Eventually though, they are offered the use of a stable, and it is here where the tableau then gathers for the finale of the production.

This year's Advent and Christmas material produced by the Methodist Connexion is a twist on this scenario, titled as it is, "There is room" – Christmas for everyone with the word "No" hidden by an image of the nativity scene.

The point is both simple and clear – for it encapsulates the gospel message that everyone is welcome and that there is room for all in the Christmas story and also in the church itself. There is room and space, and a welcome and acceptance for all.

All the main characters are mentioned, (even the sheep) reminding us that they symbolise a welcome.

There is room and a welcome for;

Wise men – reminding us that there is room for difference

Mary - reminding us that there is room for all ages and genders

Joseph - reminding us that there is room for refugees

Sheep - reminding us that there is room for all nature

Shepherds - reminding us that there is room for those who are experiencing poverty

Angel - reminding us that there is room for revelation

You and me - reminding us that there is room for us

Jesus - reminding us that there is room for God.

We will be using the "There is Room liturgy" throughout Advent and, no matter who we are and what our story is, may we all know that there is room for us in this most special of stories, and also here in our churches.

## Wantage & Grove Street Pastors REPORT OF OUR AUGUST & SEPTEMBER 2022 ACTIVITIES

We patrolled eight times during August and September.

Street Pastors patrolled in Grove visiting several areas including Saville Way shops, Millbrook Square and The Old Mill Hall among others. They spent some time chatting with a small group of 17-year-old girls sitting outside the Rugby Club and cleared up litter at the Skate Park.

In Wantage, Street Pastors met a lady who was very unsteady on her feet. She had said she was getting a lift home from her son and then she said she was getting a taxi. We stayed with her until she eventually made her way home on a bus.

Street Pastor teams were in Wantage on the opening weekend of Delaney's Club in August. The town was very busy throughout the night with a very good atmosphere.

One night we encountered a drunk young man who was being helped by a young woman. He was very wobbly and wanted to keep hugging everyone. The woman was grateful that we were able to relieve her, but soon after, the man walked away from us towards other people. He reappeared later, this time in an altercation with some other young people. This escalated and ended with a punch thrown by him and the very timely arrival of two police officers!

Street Pastors were in Wantage in September when a man who was spoiling for a fight went off and came back with a kitchen knife. A group of young men chased him off but attacked his associate instead. The man was rescued, thanks to a member of the public, who put himself between the victim and the assailants. Street Pastors stayed at a safe distance, called the police and helped the injured when it was safe to do so. We are grateful that no-one was injured by the knife. The police later made three arrests.

#### **Prayer for Ukraine**

May we, through our words, prayers and example pursue the things that make for a just peace in the world today and especially in Ukraine.

We remember with sadness those members we have lost, but we are thankful for the parts they played, and their contributions to church life. It has been a joy to welcome new families who have brought their babies and children for Infant Baptism. We hope to be able to maintain links with them and maybe encourage their repeated attendance at other services and special events. Throughout the year, worship in person has gradually become possible for more people, whilst the provision of the Zoom link has enabled others to continue participating from home.
