Whilst Pepper's training continues to go well there is still plenty of room for improvement; not least, recall off the lead and to be calmer when meeting people out in the street or when they call at the house. I am sure that she will get there and we are taking advice from experts to help us with this.

As you would expect there is a lot of information on the internet when it comes to how best to train your puppy/dog.

I was fascinated by an online course run by Absolute Dogs with the snappy title of "The Sexier Than A Squirrel Challenge", which is, so they say, a fantastic online training programme that teaches you how to get great focus, recall and even loose lead walking from your dog and how to become sexier than that squirrel!

The concept is quite simple, to make your dog so focussed on you, that you are more important ("sexier") than a squirrel, other dogs, other people or any of the 101 other distractions that can prove to be irresistible to your canine companion. The course videos show you tips and training exercises to do at home with your dog to help make this all a reality.

This idea of being focussed reminded me of a hymn written back in 1918 by Helen Lemmel (the daughter of a Methodist Minister) who was an accomplished hymn writer and soloist. Apparently she was moved to write the words and music after reading a small booklet by Lilias Trotter entitled "Focussed".

You may remember the chorus of her hymn. It was one that was sung weekly at a Methodist Sisterhood meeting that I would regularly speak at when I was in London.

"Turn your eyes upon Jesus,

Look full in His wonderful face,

And the things of earth will grow strangely dim,

In the light of His glory and grace."

I am not sure that Helen Lemmel would approve of "The Sexier Than A Squirrel Challenge" wording, or a Methodist Minister using it in a church newsletter – but, of course, we live in different times and the wording of her chorus may leave some cold, yet the concept is the same for both.

To be so focussed on the one we seek to follow that we would find fulfilment in their presence and wish to do their bidding.

Jean knew what she wanted to be from a very early age – a school teacher – and nothing was going to stop her achieving that goal. After teacher training in Leicester she began her career back in Sheffield.

On marrying John, they came to live initially in Challow and then Childrey, where Jean taught at Childrey school for the remainder of her teaching career touching the lives of many local children and their families.

Jean was a staunch Methodist with a strong and deep faith as well as being an old-fashioned socialist sometimes ruffling a few feathers when preaching!

Her father had a profound influence on Jean and growing up she accompanied him everywhere, she became a keen supporter of Sheffield United FC, however John supported Sheffield Wednesday, so there must have been some interesting conversations in their household come most Saturday evenings in the football season!

In later years Jean & John went on two round the world cruises although health issues disrupted their second cruise.

Jean had various health problems in the last few years but John was a tower of strength during this time. He insisted that after her long stay in the JR and a care home she should come back home to Childrey. Her last months were spent back where she belonged. When the end did come, it was all very quick – in fact Jean had enjoyed a meal at the "Bear" the day before she was taken ill.

We will all miss Jean, a forthright Methodist and teacher, friend and helper. May you rest in Peace and Eternal glory.

Grove Tuesday Fellowship:

The following is a briefhistory up to the present day aboutour Fellowship.Lesley Hummerston/Kath Gourlay

About 47 years ago a group of friends at the Methodist Church got together and formed a Fellowship Group that would meet on Tuesday afternoons at 2:15 pm for fellowship.

At first, they met in homes but, as they grew they moved to the church still meeting for fellowship on a Tuesday at 2:15. They continued for a number of years and some of the members left and others joined them, so taking on new roles and then some members started to bring husbands too, and the name was changed to the Tuesday Fellowship from the Women's Fellowship.

Then Covid hit, and it all changed. Some of the members died and some were reluctant to return and others moved away. We were left with just about 6 members. So it was time for a further change. We returned to meeting in homes, but just once a month. Our meetings would be a 'friendship group' rather than a 'fellowship group' and speakers were invited but although some will talk of fellowship, others may talk about holidays, trips out, books, and people they have met. So we now meet once a month on the 4th Tuesday afternoon in homes with an occasional trip to the Cornerstone and with a Christmas lunch with husbands, too.)

We are always looking for new members, both ladies and men, and, although we call ourselves the Tuesday Fellowship, it's really more of a friendship group.

It was with sadness we learned that **Jean Cliffe** died on 30th November. She was part of the village of Childrey, and a member of the Methodist Church there, for more years than most of us have been in Wantage. Not only did Jean contribute greatly to the life of the church, but, as the Headteacher of Childrey Primary School, she also played a major role in the early education of the many young children who passed through her school. We offer our prayers for her husband John, who cared for Jean as her health steadily deteriorated over the last several years.

We also learned with regret that **Joy Gee** died on 19th December, in the JR Hospital having been there for a short time. Joy and her husband Fred lived in Rowstock, but she was a member of Childrey Church for very many years. Joy was well known throughout the Circuit as a local preacher, although it is several years since she ceased to lead services. Our thoughts and prayers are with Fred and their nieces, as well as our friends in Childrey Methodist Church who have sadly lost two more of its most longstanding, loved, and respected members.

From our own church, we learned the sad news that **Roy Scholes** died on Boxing Day. We remember his time as a member of our church family with much affection. When Friday lunches first started, Roy was a regular helper and specialized in washing-up duties! Years later he liked just coming to enjoy his lunch and the company of his friends. It was comforting to learn that he had spent an enjoyable Christmas Day at the Care Home in Scotland to which he had recently moved. The following morning he passed away suddenly, but entirely peacefully. Roy had been widowed twice and had cared for each of his wives, Myra and Pam, with great dedication during their illnesses in the final years of their lives. We give thanks to God for Roy and the part he played within our church, and we offer our love and our prayers to his son Grant and all his family. During these short days of Winter, when seasonal illnesses are at their height, we are aware that several others within our congregation are also experiencing health problems. Margaret Wilson is continuing her recovery at St Katharine's, looking hopefully towards being well enough to return home. Arnold Tucker has made a very pleasing recovery after his stay in hospital before Christmas, and it is wonderful seeing him back in church worshipping with us again. We think of and pray for Carole Robbins who is recovering from a stroke, and wish her well as she regains her health and mobility. Joan and Ed Clipsham have encountered several medical problems in recent months, and our thoughts are with them both, knowing that Joan longs to be back worshipping with us each Sunday. It was encouraging when we learned of Graham Godfrey's transfer from the JR to Wallingford Community Hospital, and we continue to hold him in our prayers, as well as his carer, Tracey, and daughters Anne and Gillian who watch over him devotedly. Adrian Richens has made good progress following his serious accident, and whilst staying at Elmbrook Court his mobility has improved so much that he is now able to walk without any aids. Adrian is now returning to live at home again. As he undertakes this big step, we pray that his rehabilitation will continue, and we will hold him in our thoughts and our prayers.

Numbers at the café vary, but we had 17 visitors on a very wet morning and 22 on the New Year's Bank Holiday Monday. On one memorable morning in December we had a surprise visit by an elf and a Pets as Therapy dog. In January we were pleased to mark Brenda Edward's 90th birthday with cake. Details of the café have been added to a couple of "Warm Spaces" web-sites, which list places where people can be assured of a warm welcome and a hot drink for free.

The café does not charge for coffee or home-made cakes, but each week we have "piggy banks" for donations to a charity. From September to November we raised £500 for Sudep.
