

### From the Manse.....

I so very often find inspiration and meaning in the words of authors, playwrights and poets. Recently, I have been made aware of Ayodeji Malcolm Guite an English poet, singer-songwriter, Anglican priest, and academic.

I was struck by his Sonnet 'Ash Wednesday'. On his website (malcolmguite.wordpress.com) he explains his inspiration behind this sonnet written some 12 years ago now.

He writes; "As I set about the traditional task of burning the remnants of last Palm Sunday's palm crosses in order to make the ash which would bless and sign our repentance on Ash Wednesday, I was suddenly struck by the way both the fire and the ash were signs not only of our personal mortality and our need for repentance and renewal but also signs of the wider destruction our sinfulness inflicts upon God's world and on our fellow creatures, on the whole web of life into which God has woven us and for which He also cares."

### Ash Wednesday

Receive this cross of ash upon your brow, Brought from the burning of Palm Sunday's cross. The forests of the world are burning now And you make late repentance for the loss. But all the trees of God would clap their hands The very stones themselves would shout and sing If you could covenant to love these lands And recognise in Christ their Lord and king.

He sees the slow destruction of those trees, He weeps to see the ancient places burn, And still you make what purchases you please, And still to dust and ashes you return. But Hope could rise from ashes even now Beginning with this sign upon your brow.

May the poets and the artists, the dreamers and the prophets, continue to speak to us all this Lententide and may God give us ears and hearts to hear and act!

# Wantage & Grove Street Pastors Report of December 2022 & January 2023 Activities

We patrolled eight times during December 2022 and January 2023. We patrolled on 'Black Friday', the last Friday before Christmas, which we are pleased to say passed without major incident. Unfortunately, we were unable to patrol on New Year's Eve.

Street Pastors braved some cold and icy weather in December and January and were available to respond to a couple of incidents between individuals that were turning aggressive. Often just being present helps to keep things calm and prevent escalation.

We cleared up lots of litter, including glasses that had made their way on to the streets and we swept up broken glass on several occasions. We chatted to lots of different people - one night we spent some time chatting to a lady while she waited for a lift home. Another night we helped a couple of ladies who were having some difficulty walking home and spent quite a bit of time chatting with a couple who were concerned for a family member.

Patrols in early January were fairly quiet, as we would expect, but by the end of the month things were generally busier in Wantage.

In January we appointed Sky Shoemark as an Online Networker to help us with social media. As well as improving our Facebook page, you can now follow us on Instagram and TikTok.

A note from D Townsend on behalf of the committee

Just to keep you updated on FoodBank News for 2023 so far.

FoodBank has continued to be busy - we are averaging 3 - 5 parcels a day at the moment - half term and the week before were particularly busy. We have already delivered over 150 parcels so far this year. However, as we have seen in the past even as the need increases, so do the donations! The challenge is storing it all!

If you are someone who refers to FoodBank can I remind you to make sure your clients are getting all the help they need. We work closely with the Vale Community Impact - who have access to all sorts of advice and funding. Sign-posting to them can really make a difference.

We are as ever blessed by the support from the churches, schools and local community in terms of time, money, food donations. The biggest challenge for us is logistics - getting the food out on time to the people in need. So we are looking for a larger premises - currently we run out of two sites - the Kings Centre with it's wonderful staff and a unit on Elms Farm. Really we need to be in one place and for a nominal sum - so if you know of any large-ish (very cheap) spaces with parking (and no stairs) do get in touch.

### LINDA JOY GEE 1931 – 2022

Linda Joy Gee was born at No 5 Chapel Way, Childrey in 1931 and lived there with her parents, Edgar and Elsie Pottinger until 1977 when she married Frederick in Childrey Methodist Chapel and moved to Rowstock.

Joy followed in her father's footsteps and became a Methodist local preacher in 1960 – a role she carried out for 60 years and it was through this that she met her beloved Frederick who, although confirmed in the Church of England, had friends at Milton Methodist Chapel. He often attended Milton to listen to the various local preachers. one of whom was Joy! The rest, as they say, is history.

Joy was always very much involved in family life. She was a key figure in the lives of her great nieces and nephew. She got involved in all family activities and even went horse riding a few times.

She worked as a librarian at the Atomic Energy Research Establishment at Harwell – a very neat and tidy job which reflected her personality. Joy was also active in village life, being a member of the WI as well as several local clubs and charities. Joy and Frederick faithfully attended Childrey Methodist Chapel until increasing

### Holy Habits (lite)

This month will see the launch of our journey through Holy Habits (lite) based on the book and material from the Methodist Minister, Rev Andrew Roberts.

Using Acts 2 as his starting point, Andrew has identified 10 of what he refers to as 'Holy Habits' as practiced by the early church and challenges us to reflect on how they are of relevance to us today.

He lists; Biblical teaching, Fellowship, Breaking of bread, Prayer, Giving, Service, Eating together, Gladness and generosity, Worship, and Making more disciples.

The first Holy Habit we will be looking at is Prayer and will run from the beginning of March to the end of May.

For prayer, and indeed for each habit, there will be a specific Sunday each month during which we will explore together in worship aspects of the theme.

Bruce Almighty (Cert 12) - Thursday 20th April - to be shown in church at 7:30 pm.

There will be a book for those who like to read, followed by an opportunity to meet and discuss it in person and for people to write their thoughts, reflections on it for the newsletter, church Facebook page etc.

The book this time round is the novel, "Chasing Francis - a pilgrim's tale" by Ian Cron (ISBN 978-0-310-33669-3 published by Zondervan.)
