From the Manse.....

There is a great deal going on this month. For along with the usual two Bank Holiday Mondays that take place each May, we have an additional celebratory one on Monday 8th to mark the Coronation of His Majesty The King and Her Majesty The Queen Consort at Westminster Abbey two days earlier.

Of course, May is a significant month for us Methodists. For we recall how at around 8:45 pm on the evening of May 24th 1738 during a church meeting in Aldersgate Street, London, John Wesley felt his heart "strangely warmed". At that moment in time and space, God became real to him.

Each year the closest Sunday to May 24th, is observed as Aldersgate Sunday in the life of the Methodist Church. It gives us an opportunity to reflect on that pivotal moment in the life of John Wesley and its relevance to us today.

That feeling of a warmed heart is of course not exclusive to those of faith.

Over the years, countless people who do not attend church and have no allegiance to any particular religion have shared with me those profound moments and intense experiences when they have been stopped in their tracks and for a while, been aware of that which is beyond what can be seen, known or explained.

Those breathtaking moments of awe, wonder, beauty, magnificence and splendour that transcend the ordinary and the everyday, that help us to reach out beyond the limits of who we are to something far greater.

Whatever we find ourselves doing this May, however we will be spending our Bank Holiday Mondays, may be aware of those moments of wonder that break into our lives and in doing so warm our hearts and make the world a better place.

' CARITAS' is a Wantage based choir set up by Sheenagh Dernie in 2016 to raise money for Christian Aid, so it is no accident that our Spring concert is taking place in Christian Aid Week in Wantage Methodist Church.

Most recently we performed in the Parish Church with the South Wales Male Voice Choir (Côr Meibion de Cymru), whose website reads "We were delighted to welcome 'CARITAS', a children's choir who captivated the audience with the freshness and beauty of their sound."

In our concert on 20th May the children will have opportunities to display their diverse musical talents as well as singing with the choir. We look forward to welcoming you to the concert and to raising lots of money for Christian Aid.

Action for Hope: New implementation officer to help the Church reach net zero

Dr Hamish Leese rejoins the Connexional Team as the new Action for Hope Implementation Officer. His job is to help the Methodist Church of Britain reduce its carbon emissions, aiming for net zero by 2030. This role was made possible by funding from The Benefact Trust.



Hamish was previously part of the Connexional team working in research before coming back in January 2023. In his own words, "it's wonderful to be back working in the Methodist Church, and in such an important area as creation care.

The climate emergency is one of the most pressing concerns in the world today, but it is not merely a secular one. As Christians and Methodists we are called to care for God's Creation and challenge injustice, so climate concerns are inherently missional and part of our discipleship.

Net zero by 2030 is a challenging target and it will take all of us to achieve it." Hamish's recruitment is a milestone in the net zero carbon emissions journey started by the Methodist Church.

Reducing carbon emissions has been a long-term desire of the Methodist Church, referenced in the 2011 report *Hope in God's Future* and regularly raised by children and young people at 3Generate. Caring for creation is a core part of a Methodist Way of Life; we want all of God's created Kingdom not just to survive, but to flourish.

Closing our ears to the voices of those most vulnerable to climate change would be nothing less than giving up our claim to be disciples of Christ. Acting with renewed urgency, the 2019 Conference acknowledged the climate emergency and created an aim for net zero carbon emissions by 2030.

The Methodist Church has already started: its investment policies were changed; the new Methodist Church House in London at Tavistock Place is currently under refurbishment and will abide by the net zero emission aim; the Methodist Church is also creating resources to support churches starting their journey into becoming carbon neutral. As of September 2022, no less than 643 Methodist churches had registered for EcoChurch (England and Wales).

After creating a connexional action plan, Hamish will help Methodist districts develop their own action plans and support churches in their path to net zero emissions. The Methodist Church is hoping to have 50% of its churches to have registered with EcoChurch or EcoCongregation (Scotland), and 50% of these churches to have achieved a Bronze award by 2026.

Amongst Hamish's other responsibilities are ensuring that the new Methodist Church House in London is as good for the environment as can be and that travel, gas and electricity funded by the Methodist Church are also net zero emissions by 2030.

The Methodist Council, March 2023, Learnington Spa

The Methodist Council met at Woodland Grange, Learnington Spa between the 25th and 27th March 2023 to discuss matters relating to the life of the Church including the Walking with Micah project, the Anglican / Methodist Covenant and the composition of the Methodist Conference.

President and Vice-President Reflections

In his reflection to the Methodist Council, the President of the Methodist Conference, Rev Graham Thompson, considered the work of the Church to support those impacted by the cost of living crisis and the need to focus our work to ensure we do what we can in an exemplary way. The Vice-President, Anthony Boateng, reflected on the need to ensure that we are a church working towards revival, while acknowledging the challenges of decline in membership and church buildings.

Anglican/Methodist Covenant

Meetings between the President and Vice-President of the Conference and the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, as well as senior staff of both churches, have resulted in a mutual commitment to moving forward with the Covenant relationship.

The Council directed the Faith and Order Committee to explore with the Faith and Order Commission of the Church of England the most suitable next steps in considering *Mission and Ministry in Covenant* and to work with that Commission to draft such liturgical, legislative and other texts as may be needed.

Composition of the Conference

The Council agreed to recommend the distribution of the 225 seats which will make up the full voting membership of the Conference. The Conference had previously decided that Synod-elected members should be no less than 70% of the overall body.

The report recommends that the category of Conference-elected be abolished and replaced by members of the Connexional Council. The Connexional Council will be represented by seven of its members plus its Chair. The remaining non-District categories will represent those groups within the life of the Church.

While the aim is for the overall number of voting members to reduce to 225 at the 2024 Conference, there will need to be some transitional arrangements before the Connexional Council is established and other changes can come into effect.

Review of Safeguarding Policy and Procedures

The Council received a report on the rationalisation of the length of the Church's safeguarding documentation. The review followed consultation with key stakeholders and has reduced the document by almost one third in length. Responses indicate that practitioners welcomed the concise version of the policy with intricate procedural details moved to the appendices.

Positive Working Together

The Council recommends that the Conference adopts a 5-year programme, in partnership with Place for Hope, to offer the integrated approach in support of Positive Working Together and extending the Reconciliation and Mediation Team to become a Connexion-wide programme.

Revising the Methodist Worship Book

The Council received a report from the Faith and Order Committee, including the suggestion that there should be consultation in order to develop proposals for a fundamental revision of the Methodist Worship Book. The Council engaged in conversation about the current use of the Methodist Worship Book and what future resources and formats might be desirable. The Council agreed that a consultation process should be initiated by the Faith and Order Committee.


Report of the Mission Committee

The Mission Committee commended the Walking with Micah project report for presentation at the 2023 Conference. The Committee felt the report was powerful, exciting and challenging, and was particularly pleased with the level of participation and collaboration.

The Council also agreed to place a resolution before the 2023 Conference that "The Conference supports the call for a fourth UN Special Session on Disarmament at a future UN General Assembly."

Strategy for Justice, Dignity and Solidarity

The Council agreed the addition of Worship Leaders to the list of those roles who need to undertake mandatory EDI training. It was also directed that, as far as possible, and with consideration of personal preference, gendered titles which disclose the marital status of a woman should be avoided in all connexional meetings and correspondence.



Illegal Migration Bill - JPIT at Downing Street!

As the Illegal Migration Bill continues to pass through the UK parliament, over 1500 church leaders have stepped up and spoken out against the hostile and cruel approach the UK government is taking towards people seeking asylum in the UK. On Tuesday 4th April, representatives from our denominations as well as CTE and CTBI headed to Downing Street to share the joint statement with the Prime Minister.

Pastoral

Just a few weeks ago, we shared in the celebration of Easter on the most special day in our Christian calendar. At our Sunrise Service at 6 am, at the Millennium Stones in Ardington, which we approached in darkness, it was extremely cold. When daylight came, mist surrounded us and the sun couldn't shine through it while we were there. Nevertheless, nothing could suppress the joy we felt in being able to celebrate Christ's resurrection and all that it means to us. As we hold on to God's promise of new life through Jesus, we give thanks for the healing of several members of our church family who have been unwell and unable to worship with us. Following the injury to her leg in February, Joan Clipsham longed for her wounds to heal enough to walk again, and to be able to return to worshipping in church. As we see Joan, and others whose health problems have temporarily kept them from church, sitting in our congregation once more, we are so thankful for God's healing mercies, and reassured of his care for each one of us.

It is good to know that Jane Robinson is making progress as she recovers from her first heart operation and awaits a second one in the near future. Returning to church is one of Jane's objectives too, and we pray that she will continue to improve in health, and will be worshipping in church again before too long.

A further piece of good news is shared with us on learning that Christopher and Becca Wells have become parents for the second time. Their daughter, Susanna was born on 31st March in Ulster hospital. We remember Christopher growing up in our church along with his brother Laurence. We offer our congratulations to Chris and Becca, and acknowledge the joy this has brought to Chris's Mum, Heather, and his Dad, Graham, as grandparents. May God bless the whole family at this happy time.

It is a sad time for Keith and his family. Keith's mother died on 15th April in the Care Home in Nottingham where she had lived for the last few years. As recently as Mothering Sunday four weeks ago, Keith spoke about his Mum during our morning Service, sharing with us a beautiful letter she had written to her parents as an evacuee during the Second World War. Just as we were moved by that special memory we heard then, so we now hold Keith, Liz, Amy and Becca and all of the family in our thoughts, praying that God's love will bring them comfort and strength in their sadness.

Thirteen years ago, Sharon arrived in Wantage and immediately came to our church, bringing her joyful and animated style of worship which we soon came to associate with her and other Ghanaian friends who later joined us too. We have missed Sharon since she returned to Ghana at the end of 2021. A few weeks ago, her son, Prince, arrived in the UK, with the same objective which brought Sharon here in 2010. Like her, Prince is working as a Carer. He is with *Family Support Care*, a company in Swindon where some of his friends and relatives from Accra already work. He hopes to be able to send home some of his salary to help his family to cope financially. Sharon tells us that in Ghana inflation is unbelievably high, and constantly rising, while corruption prevents well-qualified young people from getting work. Prince has two degrees and a visa identifying him as 'highly skilled', but had

no job. We pray for him as he settles into a new life many miles from home, but with the same enthusiasm, dedication and faith that were Sharon's hallmarks.
