#### From the Manse.....

February this year brings with it both Valentine's Day and Lent – both of which speak to us about love. Indeed in all that we observe in this season of Lent, we witness love not as some mere notion or idea but as a force and power being lived out and profoundly expressed.

Malcolm Guite (the poet/priest) reminds us that of the fact that "George Herbert has written perhaps the greatest ever poem on the Divine Love that meets us in Christ, a poem in which Christ is simply named Love..." the one that opens by declaring; 'Love bade me welcome'.

Guite himself begins his own poem on love by skilfully weaving his own thoughts amongst the threads of George Herbert's, seeking to "create an archway" through which he and his readers can walk to receive that same welcome "and respond to it, perhaps a little shyly, a little hesitantly, as Herbert did."

"Love took George Herbert's hand and now takes mine, The same quick eyes, the same wry, welcome smile, The same spear-pierced and always-healing heart. He turns to me and, taking bread and wine, He spreads a table in the desert, while I hesitate and draw back, stand apart, Afraid, as always, of committed love. But I have come too far to turn away, Though Joy has vanished, she has led me here. 'So come', says Love, 'there's nothing left to prove, And nothing that you need to do or say, I am that perfect love that casts out fear, Sit with George Herbert here, then taste and see And find that all your loves are found in me."

Once more we see how 'out of the ordinary comes the extraordinary' – as we seek to encounter the divine love of God himself.

I will double check the routes just before to make sure that they are okay and none of the walks will be more than 4.5 miles.


#### Wantage & Grove Church Partnership

#### REPORT OF OUR OCTOBER & NOVEMBER 2023 ACTIVITIES

We patrolled eight times during October and November 2023.

Street Pastors met a very angry man who was carrying his friend's phone and threatening to smash the phone. We helped to calm the man down a little and persuaded him to give us the phone. We handed it in to a nearby pub and informed the phone's owner where they could collect it. The next day, the owner of the phone contacted us to thank us.

One night we met a group who we have seen a number of occasions previously. One of the girls tearfully confided some of the challenges she is facing in her life. We were able to support her. It's a privilege to be able to spend time with young people, letting them share without judging them.

Street Pastors were on hand to help a couple who got tangled up in a conflict with a young man. A kind bus driver helped by taking the couple and a Street Pastor on his bus and moving them out of the situation where they were able to get a taxi home.

A member of the public alerted us to an incident in Wantage town centre. Street Pastors attended and found a young woman being comforted by her friend. The upset lady had been in an argument with a man who appeared to be part of their friendship group. Street Pastors were able to bring calm to the situation and put a little distance between the two parties. Later in the evening we saw that the friendship had been restored and all was well between them.

Street Pastors were on hand to help supervise 200+ teenagers as they left a Wantage venue at the end of their Teens Disco. We were able to use our mobile power supply to help a young lady contact her mum to come and take her home.



# From the Learning & Development Newsletter of the Methodist Church.

# The latest newsletter focuses on the Methodist Way of Life theme 'Care'.

Under the 'Our Calling' headings, 'Learning and Caring' is grouped together. I have often wondered at this, but have come to realise over the years that learning to care needs to be at the heart of any Christian curriculum. In Brian's McLaren's book *Faith after Doubt*, he asks what our churches would look like if they became schools of Love, where the syllabus is based on exploring how we can best love God, love our neighbours, love ourselves and love our planet and all creation. Would we notice the difference? Would our churches be transformed?

As I think about the work we do in the Learning Network, I am struck by how much of what we deliver has, at its heart, the aim of learning to care well. Whether it be safeguarding training, EDI, the new pastoral care course 'Who Cares?' or line management training and support for lay employees. We are developing our understanding and skills in order to care better.

It is not always easy though; care and compassion are costly. Glennon Doyle, an American best-selling author and founder and president of *Together Rising*, an all-women-led non-profit organization supporting women, families, and children in crisis, says:

"I understand now that I'm not a mess but a deeply feeling person in a messy world. I explain that now, when someone asks me why I cry so often, 'For the same reason I laugh so often – because I'm paying attention."

When we see people in pain, communities suffering, our world in crisis we are affected at a cellular level. However, looking away is not an option, Jesus tells us in the gospel caring is the greatest commandment and therefore our challenge, as disciples, is to make it our life-long commitment, our highest calling.
