How we helped on the streets

A member of the public alerted us to an incident in Wantage town centre. Street Pastors attended and found a young woman being comforted by her friend. The upset lady had been in an argument with a man who appeared to be part of their friendship group. Street Pastors were able to bring calm to the situation and put a little distance between the two parties. Later in the evening we saw that the friendship had been restored and all was well between them.

Street Pastors met a young man who was homeless and had slept on the streets for 4 nights. Being the beginning of a very cold spell, we attempted to find emergency accommodation for him. The Police joined us and also attempted to find somewhere for the man to stay, unsuccessfully. We used our mobile power pack to put some charge into the man's phone. He was able to call a friend and arrange to sleep in their shed for the night. We gave him some soup,

snacks, a jumper and a pair of gloves to help keep him warm.

Street Pastors were out and about on New Eve Wantage. Apart from a few scuffles it was mostly a peaceful night that the Street Pastors enjoyed. As one scuffle began to Street break out Pastors decided offer lollies in an attempt to calm things down - and amazingly, it worked!

Interview with Andy Smith

Andy Smith has served as a Street Pastor since our beginning in 2009. He hung up his cap for the last time in January 2023 but at our July AGM he decided to stand as a Trustee.

What made you decide to be a Street Pastor all those years ago? While visiting a friend's church in Nottingham, we saw a presentation on Street Pastors. We were hooked! When Wantage and Grove Street Pastors began, friends said, "you'll be good at this Andy" as I worked in a prison with teenagers. Put it that way, there was no excuse; so I joined.

What will you miss? The fellowship of Christians from different churches. Chatting with people and helping them on the streets. Crawling into bed at 4am on a Sunday morning ready to be at church at 9.15!

Tell us about one of the most memorable moments: We were chatting to some lads in Betjeman Park. They went off to get a bus in the Market Place. We discovered one had left his wallet. We went to the bus stop and reunited one very happy young man with his wallet, now he could get home. Job done!

What advice would you give to someone thinking of becoming a street pastor? Pray before and during patrols. Be prepared for all types of weather! Accept compliments with humility; drunken conversation with patience. Don't ever argue, no matter the subject.

Share your faith when asked, "why do you do this?" Stand well back from potential or actual violent situations'.

What made you decide to stand as a Trustee? Now I'm 'retired' from the streets, (in the dry and warm), I felt I could still serve God through Street Pastors and become a trustee.

It's faithful individuals like Andy who keep Wantage & Grove Street Pastors on the streets of Wantage and Grove serving God by serving people. Well done Andul
