From the Manse.....

By the time you read this newsletter, the result of the Europa League Cup Final played between Manchester United and Tottenham Hotspur in the San Mames Stadium on 21st May in Bilbao will be known.

Both teams saw this final as being a way in which they could salvage something out of what, by their standards, has been a very poor and disappointing season. To lift the trophy as winners would mark some kind of success for them as well as achieving the prize of being able to play in the Champions League next season.

This prompted me to ponder and reflect as to how we mark or judge success. Is it simply about being the best, being the winner, or having the most?

Can success be measured by using either qualitive or quantitative methods?

In the run up to our half marathon, numerous posts of the LLHM Facebook page reminded those taking part that it doesn't matter what time you finish in, whether under two hours or four hours, for when you cross that finishing line, you will still have done it!

There has been much discussion and debate as to how effective OFSTED inspections are when it comes to judging the performances of Schools and as to whether they are successful or not. Can league tables ever give a true picture of what is happening or going on?

I've often wondered what would happen if there were church versions of OFSTED inspections?! How do you think we would fare if they came and spent some time with us and what kind of judgement would they give?

What criteria would you have to meet in order to be seen or described as being a successful church anyhow? Would it be the size of a congregation, the church's impact in the local community, how much is given each week, or the number of activities taking place?

Of course, no church can ever be perfect, because we are not. We seek to do our best as God's people, but we are fallible, flawed and prone to getting it wrong, but I don't think that God is asking us to perfect, to be the best at everything, to be successful in that sense but rather God is simply asking us to be faithful.

The Methodist Church and Hope Together launch Try Pilgrimage

Try Pilgrimage is a website that offers resources for individuals and churches to host local pilgrimages. It was inspired by the catholic year of Jubilee theme for 2025, "Pilgrims of Hope".

Try Pilgrimage and its resources are designed for individuals who may not have experienced pilgrimage before and are looking for a gentle introduction. There are two main pathways available on the site: one for churches and Christians interested in hosting a pilgrimage, and another for those who want to try a pilgrimage for themselves. All resources are available for free download.

Try Pilgrimage encourages Christians and non-Christians to embark on a unique journey to discover people, make new experiences and engage with their community. The website shares existing pilgrimage routes but also enables members of the public to step out of their comfort zone, create their own pilgrimages and share them on the website.

Interest in spiritual walking is at an all-time high, largely due to the BBC series "Pilgrimage" which encouraged many individuals to explore famous routes like the Camino, also known as the Way of St James going to Santiago de Compostella. However, Great Britain also offers numerous local pilgrimages that allow for a deeper engagement with the community.

Try Pilgrimage incorporates the 2023 BBC series as part of its "fuel for the journey." It offers a free downloadable discussion resource based on the program, which is suitable for both groups and individuals. Eryl Parry, the Pioneer Priest from the Diocese of Bangor, who appears in the first episode, shared her insights with us and created a series of short videos to help people understand and fully appreciate the experience of pilgrimage.

A pilgrimage can be on foot, by bike, by bus and even in a chair! Inclusion and accessibility are key to the project. Try Pilgrimage steps outside traditional pilgrimages and invites people to create transformative experiences with their community, online with a virtual prayer walk or with special activities to engage children.

Sustainable Wantage – more...

We are continuing to give a focus on Sustainable Wantage and this time focusing on the Market Garden.

Set in the grounds of <u>The Wantage Community Support Service</u> (previously The Charlton Centre), the Market Garden is a partnership between Sustainable Wantage, <u>Style Acre</u> & Oxfordshire County Council (OCC).

Style Acre and OCC are providing opportunities for people with learning disabilities from across South Oxfordshire to develop new skills and enjoy gardening. The garden is a closed site giving it a quiet and peaceful atmosphere. It has wide paths which are accessible for people with reduced mobility and it has an accessible compost toilet.

The Market Garden is a tranquil and beautiful place where members of the community are able to learn how to grow fruit and vegetables in a sustainable and attractive way. We have 2 polytunnels, a greenhouse and cold frame, an orchard area, low and raised beds, and the 'World of mint' which shows off almost 30 different varieties of this wonderful plant. A primary objective is to increase the biodiversity of the garden. To this end we maintain a small pond, a pallet bug house, multiple bird feeders and a large area of pollinator friendly flowers. Regular visitors are hedgehogs, frogs, bats, moths, butterflies, and bees.

The Market Garden is a fantastic place just to slow down and connect with nature. It is also a great space for community activities; look out for our Spring and Autumn Open Days! If you would like to help, Sustainable Wantage work parties usually meet at the garden on Sundays 2-4pm.

Our gardening volunteers enjoy the rewards of surplus veg, good conversation and excellent cake! Please contact us if you are interested in helping out and visit our <u>Facebook page</u> for the latest news.

A personal note from Helen Carter. I went to the garden for a Tai Chi session recently, and it was such a peaceful experience. I can thoroughly recommend taking any opportunity to visit there – and if you feel able to offer your time as a volunteer.

Quarterly News April 2025

Firstly, congratulations to Karen Smith - whom you may know from the Loyd Lyndsay Rooms. Karen is the new Landlord of King Alfred's Head in Wantage. And what a lovely job she's done on refurbishing the pub, both inside and out - looking really good! Welcome to Wantage Karen - we hope you're really successful.

As a teenager, I remember a couple in my church who got baptised. There was lots of joy and celebration as they emerged out of the water. They went off to get changed out of their wet clothes and came back wearing T-shirts that said, "UNDER NEW MANAGEMENT" - Brilliant! Three words that so simply convey what it is to be a Christian - "my life is now under Christ's new management".

As Christians, this 'new management' also leads to 'refurbishments' in our lives. Firstly on the inside, as we surrender our lives to Jesus' Lordship. And then on the outside as people begin to notice the changes that have taken place on the inside. Part of these 'outward refurbishments' are the acts of service and good deeds that are integral to Christian Faith. Galatians Ch 2 v 20 says,

"I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me".

And Matthew Ch 5 v 6 says,

"...let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven".

We have over 40 people volunteering in different ways - all with the purpose of helping people, serving God and ultimately glorifying our Father God. Keep up the good work / Why not join us?

How we helped on the streets

Many of our patrols at the beginning of the year have been quiet and peaceful - and this we expect, in part due to cold and wet weather, some people reigning in the excesses of Christmas and New Year celebrations, or perhaps not having enough money to go out.

One cold night, a man approached us who wasn't wearing any shoes! He said that he had come out without shoes so he could feel more connected to the earth but was somewhat regretting his decision. Of course, we gave him a pair of flip-flops - for which he was extremely grateful.

One of our afternoon patrols helped to disperse a large group of youngsters who had gathered outside Sainsbury's. The Street Pastors chatted to the young people and were able to encourage them to slowly move on.

In April our afternoon patrol was joined by Daniel Courteney, Community Safety Problem Solving Officer for Oxford City Council. Oxford City Council recently granted us some funding and were keen to see what we do to see if similar patrols might be useful in parts of Oxford. Since that time the Trustees have set about transferring assets and employees, and updating documents, resources and publicity materials.

Special thanks go to Steve West and Michael Elliott, our Treasurer, who have undertaken much of this work.

The final step will be to close the old charity (number1134429). We expect this to take place later this year.

Previously, as an Association of Members we had a membership who had voting rights. As a CIO, the members are the Trustees, but we don't want to lose touch with our previous members - but what will we call them!!!? Supporters? Friends? Partners? Well, we've chosen to call them 'Friends'. Hello friend! ♥

Pastoral

The month of June, preceded this year by the warm sunshine in May, usually provides us with so much to enjoy and celebrate within God's creation. Flora and fauna are flourishing, birdsong is at its sweetest during long midsummer days, and it seems that nature is presenting itself for our delight and appreciation. Alongside this, though, we are also aware of so much suffering in our world, generating both sadness and anxiety. The joys of creation are affirming and comforting. Being thankful for the natural beauty surrounding us is one way of reassuring ourselves that every one of us is precious in God's sight, and his love and care for us will last throughout every season and forever.

During our service on 11th May, Keith explained and launched our restructured pastoral system. Hopefully, everyone within our church family will feel cared for within a small group headed up by a member of the enlarged pastoral team. The new name for the people we used to call Pastoral Visitors is Pastoral Links. Whilst the emphasis will now concentrate less on visiting, the priority will continue to be that of care and support for each other. We hope that, as Pastoral Links, we will be sensitive to the absence from Church on Sundays of people in our group - not to check on their attendance judgementally, but to react with concern and kindness. If the absences are the consequences of ill health or other problems or difficulties, the role of the Pastoral Links will be, as always, to offer help. Prayer support immediately, alongside practical assistance, where appropriate and possible, will continue to be part of the response to most situations. We hope that the new system will be valued as much as the one it replaces, and that with God's help we will go on living out our faith in the way that we care for each other.
